I wrote a new article on [Making Your First Black and White Print](#). I have made the videos too but they are waiting to be edited before adding in to the article. The text illustrated with still photos has been available for a few weeks. It is based on the article that I wrote for the 3rd issue of [The Handmade Photograph](#) magazine / e-zine, out soon.

The drying cloth on my flatbed dryer for FB paper developed a hole in the fabric, fortunately towards the edge so I could still use it for all but the largest size (24 inch) prints. It prompted me into action. First we bought a new cloth for it from the manufacturer, then we bought another Maco Ecomat flatbed dryer identical to the existing one. This doubles the drying capacity and should mean staying up to 3am drying prints has become a thing of the past. We shall see! This prompted me into writing a tutorial on [Drying Fibre Based Papers Using a Flatbed Dryer](#).

New Lecture - City Light

My new lecture City Light is finished!

Many thanks to Ilford Photo (Harman Technology) for their very generous gift of the Multigrade FB glossy 20 x 16 inch paper needed to make the prints as well as quite a lot of chemistry to get me well on the way. Without this support I doubt that I would print new lectures, it's over £1000 a lecture in materials alone at full price.

The lecture comprises 85 prints, 45 cities to start with then 25 for the Alpine Pass Route (see below) and 15 for New Zealand, Sydney and Hong Kong.

So far I have given it 3 times and I am pleased the way it hangs together. Lots of hints and tips on how I do my photography.

I am listing all of my lecture bookings on [DarkroomDave as Events](#). This automatically displays a map of each location when I type the address in to each entry. Have a look here if you are interested in coming along. Most, if not all clubs, welcome visitors for a small fee of £2 or £3. Failing that just say you're with me!

If you are in, or know someone in, a photo club please pass on this newsletter in case they are interested in booking me. We travel across the UK, as long as my very reasonable fee is paid and we can sell my books and courses to the members!

New Photos

I'm still working hard scanning negatives for the 2 new books so there are lots of new landscape photographs on the web.

In addition, I have added new photographs of the 205 mile Alpine Pass Route that we completed in September 2013. The [trip log and photos](#) have been added to my main gallery web site.

In case it's of interest I wrote a blog post of the 85 mile [Lake District Trek](#) that I did in June with good friend Al from Gloucester. It includes both the photos from my Mamiya 7 film camera and the Samsung Galaxy S3 versions taken at the same time. I edited the phone photos with Snapseed - just converted to black and white, cropped, then adjusted brightness and contrast. Nowhere near identical but an interesting comparison. You should be able to recreate our route as well from the information that I provided. It was a very sociable hike and we managed a creditable 14 miles to the gallon (of beer!).

We visited Vienna in September so I have over 50 shots that I want to add to the website. It was jolly hard work involving walking 20 miles and over 12 hours of photography on one of the days. I think we may have got carried away! Hopefully I will have a few scanned for the next newsletter.


